TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN



NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

The Town of Carleton Place has completed a study process that resulted in the municipality's first **Transportation Master Plan (TMP)**. The TMP is a strategic planning document that identifies transportation infrastructure improvements over the next two decades, including identifying policies, guidelines, and recommendations to meet the needs of all modes of transportation including walking, cycling, transit, and cars. The plan considers future community needs and emerging trends in transportation solutions, such as complete streets and a system that is inclusive and accessible to a broad spectrum of society.

The TMP was conducted in accordance with the Master Planning process following the requirements of Phases 1 & 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 & 2015) by the Municipal Engineers Association, an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The TMP addresses need and justification at a broad level and recommended infrastructure projects will require further detailed studies as per the Municipal Class process.
